It was noted that Adrienne is pursuing becoming a Provisional Chief Horse Management Judge (a national position). This takes a minimum of 2 years and often requires quite a bit of personal financial commitment.

A motion was made by Jolene Rassmunsen for the region to financially help Adrienne by sending her to the Annual Symposium. Discussion was held that it might be more beneficial to help in other ways. After much discussion, the motion was amended by Anita Collins: The Region will start a Scholarship in which members in our region may apply for, after they are nominated and recommended as a Provisional candidate by a National Chief. The amount of this scholarship will be up to \$500 annually (renewed for up to 2 years) and will go towards approved expenses (approved by the Regional Leadership Council) that would specifically benefit the advancement as a provisional chief. Jolene Rasmussen seconded the motion and it was approved by all.

It was also noted that we need to possibly raise the amount that the NYC candidates get for travel expenses to the Annual Symposium. A motion was made by Lisa that the region will pay for registration and up to \$500 for travel expenses for the NYC Delegate. The motion was seconded by Diane, and approved by all.
