ALL Out of State Horses must have a current Negative Coggins in compliance with state law.

ALL Horses must have a brand inspection in compliance with state law.

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** No refunds for cancellations after July 4, 2020 unless accompanied by a valid doctor's note (for either the horse or rider).

**TEAMS:** All Campers will be divided into teams by the Organizer.

**CHAPERONES:** Each club **MUST** have at least one designated chaperone per 6 riders, at least 21 years old, on the grounds at all times during the camp.

**T SHIRTS:** All Campers will receive a T-Shirt with their entry. Please indicate your preferred size (unisex) on the entry form. Additional T-Shirts can be purchased at a cost of \$15 per Shirt. We will do our best to get the size requested, but **specific sizes are not guaranteed.**

## **CLINICIANS:**

### ***Attila Rajnai***

Attila started riding at the age of 16. He has always had an interest in horses. He was the first in his family to do so, and although his family was supportive, Attila had to take a lot of initiative on his own, sometimes riding his bike 12 mi a day to reach the stable! In high school there was a show jumping stable near the school where Attila received his first formal education with horses. Competing in the Hungarian C.I.C 1star Championships at the age of 18 he finished 3rd in the YR div. and 4th in the Junior class.

After graduating he moved to Germany to train with Beeke Kaack (a 4 star rider) as a working student. Attila spent his time grooming and riding young horses, and competing for a year and a half, before moving on to receive an assistant position with Nicolai Aldinger, who was working for Olympic Champion, Andreas Dibowski. Attila spent 1 and half years involved with that program before moving to the United States where he hopes to continue on to his Olympic goals.

UPDATE: Attila ranked 3rd place eventing rider in Hungary - 2016!!

### ***Erin Storey***

Erin has over 25 year of experience riding and competing in multiple disciplines. She began competing at a very early age in competitive/ endurance riding and had completed her first one-day 50-mile endurance ride at the age of 10.

She was also active in both 4-H and Pony Club all through her youth. She continued into adulthood as a Pony Club member graduating with her National C-3 rating.

In her early 20's she started competing primarily in the Eventing discipline. She has restarted several off the track Thoroughbreds and competed through the preliminary level in USEA competition.

Erin enjoys teaching to all ages while focusing on horsemanship and balanced riding in a safe and fun environment. She travels throughout the Northwest competing in USEA recognized Eventing and is able to help with coaching and hauling to competitions.

## **TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:**

The Camp will include:

**STABLING AND TACKROOMS:** Stabling will be either in portable stalls with 2 bags of shavings provided OR in outside pipe pens with NO shavings provided. (Shavings are not required in the outside pipe pens.) Shavings are available for purchase at D&B Supply in Garden City if desired. Tack and feed rooms will be set up in trailers that need to be provided by their clubs. Parents must pack to be independent of their trailers. Trailers, if used in the camp, may not be used as sleeping accommodations. Horses must wear leather or break away halters at all time in the stalls. **Stalls need to be stripped prior to leaving.**

**SET UP:** Campers may arrive to set-up after 3pm on Friday evening.

**ATTIRE:** Schooling (polo shirts and breeches) attire is acceptable. Vests are recommended for Cross Country.

**REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:** As listed for overnight rallies in the 2020 USPC Horse Management Handbook. All campers must wear a medical armband with a current signed medical release form inserted or a medical bracelet at all times when on the grounds. They will not be allowed to compete in the Camp without this armband and form or bracelet.

**GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES:**

**Dogs are NOT allowed.** It will be hot during the day so please be prepared with ways to hydrate and cool your self down. Don't forget sunscreen!

**FOOD:** **NO food will be provided.** You are responsible for your own food during the camp. Water stations will be setup throughout the site. Bring your own water bottle to refill and keep with you. The town of Eagle is only 5 minutes away with convenience stores, grocery stores, and restaurants.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** Campers and chaperones are strongly encouraged to camp on the grounds. It greatly enhances the children's camp experience, helps them make wonderful regional friends and provides them with lasting memories! Primitive camping is available in the field. No RV hook ups are available, but there is space for RV parking.
