******NOTE*** This entry is being sent only to DC's and club officers. The DC is responsible for distributing it to club members. Entries must be submitted by the DC. DC's are responsible for entering entries electronically and sending in all required forms.***

ENTRY FEES:

\$125.00 per horse/rider combination. \$60 for Horseless. *Stabling for Thursday night is included.* Check in on Thursday is after 3pm.

ALL Out of State Horses must have a current Negative Coggins in compliance with state law.

ALL Horses must have a brand inspection in compliance with state law.

CANCELLATION POLICY: No refunds for cancellations after June 3, 2022 unless accompanied by a valid doctor's note (for either the horse or rider).

TEAMS: All Campers will be divided into teams by the Organizer.

CHAPERONES: Each club **MUST** have at least one designated chaperone per 6 riders, at least 21 years old, on the grounds at all times during the camp.

T SHIRTS: All Campers will receive a T Shirt with their entry. Please indicate your preferred size (unisex) on the entry form. Additional T-Shirts can be purchased at a cost of \$20 per T Shirt. We will do our best to get the size requested, but **specific sizes are not guaranteed.**

CROSS COUNTRY, DRESSAGE CLINICS:

Cross Country clinic will be offered at the following levels:

Ground Poles

18" (Crossrails and some natural obstacles)

2'3" (may include water and ditches)

2'7" (may include water and ditches)

2'11" (may include water and ditches)

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:

The Camp will include:

- Group Cross Country Lesson
- Group Dressage Lesson
- Group Games lesson
- Horse Management lessons
- Arts & Crafts

STABLING AND TACKROOMS: Stabling will be in outside pipe pens with no shavings. Shavings are not provided for the pipe pens, but they are available for purchase at D&B Supply in Garden City if desired. Tack and feed rooms will be set up in trailers that need to be provided by their clubs. Parents must pack to be independent of their trailers. Trailers, if used in the camp, may not be used as sleeping accommodations. Horses must wear leather or break away halters at all time in the stalls. **Stalls need to be stripped prior to leaving.**

SET UP: Campers may arrive to set-up after 3pm on Thursday evening.

ATTIRE: Schooling (polo shirts and breeches) attire is acceptable. Vests are required for Cross Country at all levels. **All campers must wear a medical armband with a current signed medical release form inserted or a medical bracelet at all times when on the grounds. They will not be allowed to compete in the Camp without this armband and form or bracelet.**

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT: As listed for overnight rallies in the 2022 USPC Horse Management Handbook.

LONGEING: Longeing must follow USPC Standards and Safety Procedures and only may be done with the consent of the Organizer. Longeing is only allowed during the time designated by the Organizer and in the designated longeing area.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES:

Dogs are NOT allowed. It will be hot during the day so please be prepared with ways to hydrate and cool your self down. Don't forget sunscreen!

FOOD: **NO food will be provided.** You are responsible for your own food during the camp. Water stations will be setup throughout the site. Bring your own water bottle to refill and keep with you. Shopping is only 5 minutes away with convenience stores, grocery stores, and restaurants.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Campers and chaperones are strongly encouraged to camp on the grounds. It greatly enhances the children's rally experience, helps them make wonderful regional friends and provides them with lasting memories! Primitive camping is available in the field. No RV hook ups are available, but there is space for RV parking.

DIRECTIONS:

From I-84 take Exit 46 toward ID-55 N/S Eagle Road. You will travel approximately 4.4 miles. Turn Left onto US-20 W/US -26 W/W Chinden Blvd. Travel 3 miles. Turn right onto N Linder Road (Fred Meyer will be on your right). At the bottom of the hill (in 0.7 miles) Turn Left onto Duck Alley Road. Follow the signs for camping and stalls.
