**ENTRY FEES:**

REGULAR PRICE: \$120.00 per horse/rider combination.

Stabling: \$25.00 per horse, per night.

If you would like to arrive Friday, you can check in after 4 pm.

ALL Out of State Horses must have a current Negative Coggins in compliance with state law, a copy of which must be included with your entry forms.

ALL Horses must have a brand inspection in compliance with state law.

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** No refunds for cancellations after the closing date, May 7th unless spot can be filled from wait list or accompanied by a valid doctor's note (for either the horse or rider).

**TEAMS:** Consist of 3 or 4 riders and a Stable Manager. Stable Managers may be any rating. If your club does not have a complete team, either call other clubs to make up a scrambled team, or send in such entries to be placed on scrambled teams by the Organizer. Do not hesitate to enter if you do not have a full team.

**CHAPERONES:** Each club **MUST** have at least one designated chaperone, at least 21 years old, on the grounds at all times during the rally. The chaperone may not be a coach. A chaperone may be responsible for only one club.

**VOLUNTEERS:** Each club must supply two adult volunteers. Please send the volunteer names along with your entry paperwork. **Volunteers CANNOT be the designated team coaches.**

**COACHES:** Each club must supply one adult coach. **Coaching is permitted at a USPC Show Jumping Rally. Coaches must sign Guidelines for Coaching form and include with entries.**

**RALLY KITS:** Each Team must supply own

**LONGEING:** Longeing must follow USPC Standards and Safety Procedures and only may be done with the consent of the CHMJ. Longeing is only allowed during the time designated by the CHMJ and in the designated longeing area.

**GENERAL INFORMATION:**

1. This rally is open to all Pony Club Members in good standing.
2. This rally will be held as a team competition.

Teams will be composed of 3 or 4 riders and a stable manager.

NOTE: If you have a full team from your club – you will be required to supply your stable manager.

Teams can be made up of riders with different certifications and competing in different divisions. Scramble teams for competitors without a team will be created.

3. A rider competes at the level of his horse regardless of his/her certification.
4. Each rider will ride 3 rounds from their division.

**DIVISIONS:** Competitors may choose their Division regardless of their rating level (with the exception of the Junior Division).

**DIVISIONS (LEVELS):**

**Ground Poles**

**Cross Rails**

**2'**

**Sm/Med Ponies – 2'3"-2'5"**

**Intermediate Jumpers 2'5"-2'7"** (was Introductory) - May include horses and ponies of all sizes  
**Novice Jumpers 2'9"-2'11"**(was Developing Horse/Rider) • May include horses, medium and large ponies; distances in combinations will be adjusted accordingly.

**Advanced (covers Horse I-IV):**

- **Pony Jumpers 3'1"-3'3"**—May include medium and large ponies. All ponies entered in this division must be prepared to jump the heights and spreads listed in the specifications listed in Appendix VI.
- **Low Jumpers 3'1"-3'3"**
- **Medium Jumpers – 3'5"-3'7"**
- **High Jumpers – 3'9"-3'11"**

**TENTATIVE CLASSES:**

All Classes will be run under USPC Show Jumping Rules Articles 30 and 34. Ties will not be broken. Jump-offs will not be held.

1. Optimum Time A
2. Faults and Equitation Score
3. Optimum Time B

**ATTIRE:**

Schooling (polo shirts and breeches) or Show Jumping Competition Attire is acceptable. USPC approved (SEI/ASTM) helmets and appropriate footwear are mandatory for ALL riders. Medical Armbands or Bracelets with all required information must be worn at all times.

**HORSE MANAGEMENT:**

Horse Management will be judged for the duration of the rally.

Each team will need to set up a tack room using their trailers.

**\*\* Tack Room Trailers will be located in "Barn Area" and will NOT be accessible before or after barn hours OR available for sleeping accommodations!**

Feed Rooms will not be provided. Teams may use an extra trailer for all feed

OR

hay may be bagged or securely covered (inaccessible to horses) and placed on ground in front of tack rooms and concentrates/supplements may be placed inside of Tack Room Trailers (existing tack rooms in front of trailers may also be used). See HM Rulebook for specifications.

**CHAPERONE OR EMERGENCY CONTACT FORM:**

Each club must provide 1 designated chaperone at least 21 years old for EVERY team. The chaperone must remain on the grounds for the duration of the rally. The Chaperone's duties form must be filled out and signed by each chaperone and returned with your entry. Please list the names of the competitors each chaperone is responsible for on the form by the signature.

For adults – please submit the Emergency Contact Form.

**SET UP:** Teams which arrive early may unload equipment, but MAY NOT begin to set up before 4 pm on Friday. Be sure to arrive enough ahead of the Official Rally Opening to have your horses settled and your stalls and tack room completely set up by 8 am Saturday.

## **TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:**

                          (This facility houses full-time boarding and certain areas are off limits)

- 8:00 am            Official Rally Opening - Introductions and Briefing, all setup must be complete.  
9:00 am            First Formal Inspection  
9:30 - 4:00        Jump rounds commence
- 8:00 - 4:00        Horse Management Inspection (set up, safety & required equipment checks)  
4:00 pm            Parade of Clubs (unmounted - bring club banner) Followed by Awards Ceremony

**STABLING AND TACK ROOMS:** Stabling will be in outside pipe pens with no shavings. Shavings are available for purchase at Valley Country Store in Bellevue. Tack and feed rooms will be set up in trailers. Parents must pack to be independent of their trailers. Trailers, if used in the rally, may not be used as sleeping accommodations. Horses must wear leather or break away halters at all times in the stalls. Stalls must be stripped before leaving

**REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:** As listed for overnight rallies in the 2023 USPC Horse Management Handbook. Be sure to bring everything on the list! You will be penalized for missing items! All competitors must wear a medical armband with a current signed medical release form inserted or a medical bracelet at all times when on the grounds. They will not be allowed to compete in the Rally without this armband and form or bracelet.

**AWARDS:** Team Ribbons to 5<sup>th</sup> place. Individual Ribbons per Division to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Team Horse Management Ribbons to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Sportsmanship Award.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES:**

It gets COLD here at night, especially spring ! Low 40's and even 30's are possible. Daytime temps will be in the 60's or 70's. **Be prepared for possible rain showers.**

**FOOD:** NO food will be provided. You are responsible for your own food during the rally. Water stations will be set up throughout the site. Bring your own water bottle to refill and keep with you. The town of Bellevue is only 5 minutes away with convenience stores, grocery store, and restaurants.
