OPENING DATE: Tuesday, May 28, 2019

EARLY BIRD ENTRY DATE: Tuesday, June 18, 2019

CLOSING DATE: Tuesday, July 2, 2019

Entries must be entered/postmarked on or after the opening date and on or before the closing date. If not postmarked on or between these dates, the club will be assessed a \$50 fee.

Due to limitations on stabling, number of riders are limited so send in your entries early to secure your spot!

ENTRY FEES:

EARLY BIRD PRICE: \$120.00 per horse/rider combination if postmarked on or before June 18th. Any incomplete Early Bird entries are NOT eligible for discount. All paperwork, fees, and signatures must accompany the Early Bird entry for it to receive the discounted rate.

REGULAR PRICE: \$140.00 per horse/rider combination if postmarked between June 19th and July 2nd. Stabling for Thursday night is included. Check in is on Thursday after 3pm.

REFUND POLICY: No refunds for scratches after July 2, 2019 unless accompanied by a valid doctor's or veterinarian's note, in which case the entry fee, less a \$50.00 office fee, will be refunded to the club.

ALL out of state horses must have a current negative Coggins and Health Certificate in compliance with state law. ALL horses must have a brand inspection in compliance with state law.

TEAMS: All camp participants will be divided into “teams” by the Organizer based on certification level and age.

LEVELS: All levels of Pony Clubbers are invited and encouraged to attend! The following levels will be offered:

Ground Poles

18” (crossrails and some natural obstacles)

2’3” (may include water and ditches)

2’7” (may include water and ditches)

2’11” (may include water and ditches)

3’3” (may include water and ditches; there are limited training level XC jumps)

Although it is recommended that you clinic at the same level you will be competing in the Rally, it is not required. Horses and riders should be prepared to ride IN THE OPEN but if there are very green riders who may need extra assistance, please indicate that on the entry form.

ATTIRE: Schooling (polo shirts and breeches) attire is acceptable. Equestrian body protectors (aka jumping vests or safety vests) are REQUIRED for Cross Country.

CHAPERONE OR EMERGENCY CONTACT FORM: Each club MUST have at least one designated chaperone, at least 21 years old, on the grounds at all times during the camp. Adults please submit the Emergency Contact Form.

STABLING AND TACKROOMS: Stabling will be available for Camp participants only and is included in the entry fee. Stabling will be available on Thursday at conclusion of Dressage Rally through Friday until conclusion of Camp. If you are NOT participating in the Camp - due to the limited amount of stabling at Winter Sun Horse Park - you will need to move your mount off-site by Thursday night. Off-site stabling can be arranged at River Sage Stables for \$20/night by calling Sarah at 208.316.1212.

Stabling will be in outside pipe pens with no shavings. Shavings are available for purchase at The Valley Country Store in Bellevue, however they are not required. Tack and feed rooms will be set up in trailers. Parents must pack to be independent of their trailers. Trailers, if used in the camp, may not be used as sleeping accommodations. Horses must wear leather or break away halters at all time in the stalls. Stalls need to be CLEANED VERY WELL prior to leaving.

SET UP: Campers may arrive to set-up after 3pm on Thursday evening.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT: As listed for overnight rallies in the 2019 USPC Horse Management Handbook. All campers must wear a medical armband with a current signed medical release form inserted or a medical bracelet at all times when on the grounds. They will not be allowed to participate in the Camp without this armband and form or bracelet.

WEATHER:

It gets COLD here at night, even in the summer! Low 40’s and even 30’s are possible. Daytime temps will be in the 80’s or 90’s.

FOOD: NO food will be provided. You are responsible for your own food during the camp. Water stations will be setup throughout the site. Bring your own water bottle to refill and keep with you. WATER IN THE STABLING AREA IS NOT POTABLE AND SHOULD NOT BE CONSUMED. The town of Bellevue is only 5 minutes away with convenience stores, grocery store, and restaurants.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Campers and chaperones are strongly encouraged to camp on the grounds. It greatly enhances the children’s rally experience, helps them make wonderful regional friends and provides them with lasting memories! Primitive camping is available in the field. No RV hook ups are available, but there is space for RV parking.

DIRECTIONS:

From Highway 75 in Bellevue, turn west on Broadford Road. After going over the bridge, turn left on Lower Broadford Road. After about 1 mile, turn right on Townsend Gulch Road. Farm is first property on the right at 26 Townsend Gulch Road and parking is behind the hay barn. **PLEASE RESPECT THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT OF 25MPH ON BROADFORD AND TOWNSEND ROADS!!!! ORGANIZER RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ASK PARTICIPANTS TO LEAVE IF SPEED LIMIT IF NOT OBEYED.**
