Spur Wing Stables has a gorgeous 70 acre facility that offers a lovely, inviting cross country course as well as a mix of Equestrian ProTex and Arena Aid footing in the show jumping arena. **Dressage will be on grass.** Come check it out!

**RULES:** The rally will be conducted under the following rules:

**ENTRY FEES:**

- \$240.00 per horse/rider combination (includes stabling *on Friday and Saturday night*)
- Stable Managers (non-riding) - No Charge
- Riding Stable Managers - \$240.00
- Make checks payable to: Boise Pony Club (BPC)

ALL Out of State Horses must have a current Negative Coggins in compliance with state law.

ALL Horses must have a brand inspection in compliance with state law.

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** No refunds for cancellations after July 1, 2023 unless accompanied by a valid doctor's note (for either the horse or rider).

**TEAMS:** Consist of 3 or 4 riders, a Stable Manager, and possibly an Assistant Stable Manager. Stable Managers may be any rating. Younger/lower-level members may be placed as an Assistant Stable Manager.

C1's (and above) may be riding Stable Managers.

Team members can ride in different Divisions and be of mixed Rating levels

If your club does not have a complete team, either call other clubs to make up a scramble team, or *send in entries to be placed on scramble teams by the Organizer.* Do not hesitate to enter if you do not have a full team.

**CHAPERONES:** Each club MUST have at least one designated chaperone, at least 21 years old, on the grounds at all times during the rally. The chaperone may not be a coach. A chaperone may be responsible for only one club. Chaperones must sign chaperone forms and submit with entries.

**VOLUNTEERS:** Each club must supply two adult volunteers. Please sign up using the signup genius link: <https://www.signupgenius.com/go/508054ea5ab2caafe3-boise#/>

**COACHES:** Each club must supply one adult coach.

**RALLY KITS:** Each team must supply own.

**LUNGING:** Lunging must follow USPC Standards and Safety Procedures and only may be done with the consent of the CHMJ. Lunging is only allowed during the time designated by the CHMJ and in the designated lunging area.

**DIVISIONS:** Competitors may choose their Division regardless of their rating level. Members are reminded to “sign up for success” and choose an appropriate level of riding, generally one level lower than currently schooling confidently. The DC needs to review and confirm the level is safe and appropriate.

#### **Ground Poles:**

Dressage: 2023 USDF Introductory Level Test A, small arena [USDF Intro A](#)  
Cross country: 8 -10 ground poles. Optional water. No ditches or oxers.  
Show jumping: 6 - 8 ground poles.  
Ground Poles will have no time limit; however excessive speed will be penalized!

#### **Crossrails – 18”**

Dressage: 2022 USEA Starter Test, small arena [USEA Starter](#)  
Cross country: 8 -10 crossrails not to exceed 18”. Optional water. No ditches or oxers.  
Show jumping: 6 - 8 crossrails not to exceed 18”. No combinations or oxers.  
Crossrails will have no time limit; however excessive speed will be penalized!

#### **Intro – 2’3”**

Dressage: 2022 USEA Starter Test, small arena [USEA Starter](#)  
Cross country: 8 -10 simple, straightforward obstacles not to exceed 2’3”. Water may be included.  
Show jumping: 6 - 8 obstacles not to exceed 2’3”. No combinations.  
Beginner Novice will have no time limit; however excessive speed will be penalized!

#### **Beginner Novice – 2’7”**

Dressage: 2022 USEF Beginner Novice Test A, small arena [USEF Ben Novice A](#)  
Cross country: 8 - 12 obstacles not to exceed 2’7”. Water may be included.  
Show jumping: 8 - 10 obstacles not to exceed 2’7”. One 2 stride combination may be included.

Beginner Novice will have no time limit; however excessive speed will be penalized!

### **Novice – 2’11”**

Dressage: 2022 USEF Novice Test A, small arena [Novice A](#)  
Cross Country: 10 - 14 obstacles not to exceed 2’11”. Water and Ditches may be included.  
Show Jumping: 8 - 10 obstacles not to exceed 2’11”. One 2 stride combination may be included.  
This Division will be timed. Speed: 325 mpm\*. Excessive speed will be penalized.

### **Novice/Training – 3’3” show jumping, 2’11” cross country**

Dressage: 2022 USEF Training Test A, small arena [Training Test A](#)  
Cross Country: 10 - 14 obstacles not to exceed 2’11”. Water and Ditches may be included.  
Show Jumping: 9 - 12 obstacles not to exceed 3’3”. Combinations may be included.  
This Division will be timed. Speed: 325 mpm\*. Excessive speed will be penalized.

\*These paces are slower than recognized events due to the size of the facility.

### **TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:**

Thursday – ok to enter facility, set up campers and stalls.

2 pm Teams may begin to set up tack and feed trailers, barn opens  
5:30 pm Official Rally Opening, Introductions & Briefing  
6pm Cross Country course open for course walk  
6 pm Jog-outs  
7:30 pm Barn closes

#### Saturday

7:00 am Barns open, horses must be fed  
8:00 am Briefing (if needed)  
9:00 am First Formal Inspection  
9:45 am Dressage  
1:30 pm Safety Checks & Warm-up for Cross Country will begin  
2:00 pm First Cross Country Ride  
3:15 – 5:45 Turn backs  
6 pm Feed horses  
6:15 pm Stables close (stables open for one hour for visitors to walk through)  
6:30 pm Stadium course open for course walk  
7:15 pm Barns Close  
Throughout the day: Horse Management Inspection (includes set up, safety & required equipment checks)

#### Sunday

7:00 am Barns open (All horses must be fed at this time)  
8:00 am Briefing  
9:00 am First Safety inspection  
9:30 am Stadium Jumping  
12:00 pm Parade of Clubs (unmounted - bring club banner)  
Followed by Awards Ceremony  
Stalls must be inspected before allowed to leave  
3:00 pm Everyone leaves with the facility cleaner than we found it

**STABLING AND TACKROOMS:** Stabling will be in outside pipe pens with no shavings. Shavings are available for purchase at D&B Supply in Meridian or Garden City, however they are not required. Tack and feed rooms will be set up in trailers. Parents must pack to be independent of their trailers. Trailers, if used in the rally, may not be used as sleeping accommodations. Horses must wear leather or break away halters at all time in the stalls. **Stalls must be stripped before leaving.** Stalls must be inspected to exit.

**SET UP:** Teams which arrive early may unload equipment, set-up camper and stalls, but **MAY NOT** begin to set up before 2 pm on Friday. Be sure to arrive enough ahead of the Official Rally Opening to have your horses settled and your stalls and tack room completely set up by 8am Saturday.

**ATTIRE:** Schooling (polo shirts and breeches) competition attire is acceptable. Vests are required for Cross Country. **All competitors must wear a medical armband with a current signed medical release form inserted or a medical bracelet at all times when on the grounds. They will not be allowed to compete in the Rally without this armband and form or bracelet.**

**REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:** As listed for overnight rallies in the 2022 USPC Horse Management Handbook. Be sure to bring everything on the Required Equipment List! You will be penalized for missing items! Participants should come prepared including all feed portioned out and labeled, all equipment labeled, etc.

**AWARDS:** Team Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup> place. Individual Ribbons per Division to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Team Horse Management Ribbons to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Sportsmanship Award. Two Best Conditioned Awards: GP/XR/2'3" & BN/N/N/T.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES:**

**Dogs are NOT allowed.** It will be hot during the day so please be prepared with ways to hydrate and cool yourself down. Don't forget sunscreen!

**FOOD:** **NO food will be provided for participants.** You are responsible for your own food during the rally. Water stations will be setup throughout the site. Bring your own water bottle to refill and keep with you. Shopping is only 5 minutes away with convenience stores, grocery store, and restaurants.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** Competitors and chaperones are strongly encouraged to camp on the grounds. It greatly enhances the children's rally experience, helps them make wonderful regional friends and provides them with lasting memories! Primitive camping is available in the field. No RV hook ups are available, but there is space for RV parking.
